Also to the Rotaract Club of Atlanta for their contributions.

Beginning Friday the 13th the students toured the National Center for Civil & Human

Rights. Chris McNaboe was the guest speaker from the Carter Center who works in the conflict resolution program. During the tour many students remarked that they hadn't realized the power of a peaceful protest.

On Saturday (01/14/17) the students were brought to the very charming and beautiful Oglethorpe University. Larry Hart taught them the art of having "Fierce Conversations". A fairly common remark from many students was that conversation is what makes the relationship.

The students worked in assembly line fashion and prepared 10,000+ meals for distribution by *Stop Hunger Now*. Many of the students liked having the opportunity to do a service project, and expressed amazement that with just an hour of work by the group, they could feed 10,000+ people.
